Players Code of Conduct

As a player, you represent the Birmingham United Soccer Association when you travel, train and play. The actions of one player can affect the image of all of us. This Code of Conduct encourages you to play with good sportsmanship and to treat players, coaches, referees and parents with respect. It also identifies the possible consequences you will encounter when you can't behave in an appropriate manner.

Treat the Game, BUSA, and all involved with Respect.

Treat Your Team and Coach with Respect

Show respect by committing to the game, your team, and your improvement. Work hard each session, each game. Hard work will make you a better player and person. Gain respect because of your actions and play, not talk. Listen to your coach. Do what the coach asks of you without complaining. If you do not understand, ask questions in a respectful manner. Be early to meetings, training and games. Be responsible for your own equipment. Be responsible for your actions and play. Please remember, in an environment of mutual respect and hard work, the game will be much more enjoyable.

Treat Referees with Respect

Never, ever, touch a referee except to shake hands. Always address referees as "sir" or "ma'am" when speaking to them, no matter how old they are. Do not talk back to referees. If a referee speaks to you, your response should be respectful and to the point. Do not confront a referee or question calls during play. Your coach will communicate with the Referee and Assistants. Referees make mistakes. Remember that the next time you make a mistake during play. Making mistakes is a part of life.

Treat Your Opponents with Respect

Compete with class. Whether you win or lose, do so with class. Shake hands after games. No alcohol, drugs, profanity or fighting are ever permitted at soccer games or practice.

Treat Fields and all BUSA equipment with Respect

Field and equipment cost a lot of money to build and maintain. Whenever you do something that damages the field, someone has to pay to fix it. That someone is your family – almost half of the money you pay to play soccer goes into field maintenance. Goals, nets, benches, fences, and corner flags are expensive. Don't abuse them. Don't climb on the goals or nets. Don't move the corner flags. Don't climb the fence – use the gate.

Grievances and Consequences

- If you can't play by the rules in this Code of Conduct, there will be consequences. They are managed by the BUSA Executive Director and President.
- The Executive Director and/or the President may impose penalties including reprimands, suspension of playing privileges, and expulsion from a team or the club.
- The Alabama Soccer Association and/or the Central Alabama Soccer League, US Club Soccer, ECNL or USSF may respond to certain actions that take place during events they sanction (league matches, tournaments, etc.), such as the following: Confrontations with or touching a referee during or after a game. Confrontations, shoving matches, or fighting between players of opposing teams. These governing bodies have the authority to impose fines and suspensions above and beyond those imposed by the Birmingham United Soccer Association. If you are red-carded from a game, you will be suspended for at least one game, and possibly for as much as five years if what you did was very violent or involved touching a referee.
- In addition to the above consequences, note that Section 13A-11-144, Code of Alabama 1975 establishes up to Class A felony status for the offenses of harassment of, menacing of, or assault on a sports official performing his or her official duties. In other words, you can go to jail for touching a referee.
